




Founded in 1984, Bobby Goldsmith Foundation (BGF) is Australia's longest running HIV care and support organisation. Our purpose is to empower and support people living with HIV (PLHIV) to live well.

Now with a base in Adelaide, BGF can provide direct financial support for PLHIV in South Australia to help people manage the cost of their health.

WHO WAS BOBBY GOLDSMITH?



Bobby Goldsmith was one of the first Australians to die from an AIDS-related illness in 1984. He was 38 years old and is remembered as Australia's swimming sensation at the world's first Gay Games, held in San Francisco in 1982. He had been instrumental in fundraising to help

send athletes to the Games and his activities were rewarded with personal success. Bobby returned home with 17 of the Australian team's 21 medals.

When Bobby died, his friends had established the important principle of providing support and services for people living with HIV. Their legacy is Bobby Goldsmith Foundation, which continues the work of Bobby's dedicated group of friends and family.

LIVING WITH HIV?

BGF works to ensure PLHIV have access to treatments and can remain adherent to vital medications.

If you are living with HIV and on low income in South Australia, you may be eligible to access BGF support.

Direct financial assistance is capped annually and, if eligible, can be accessed for expenses such as:



HIV medications – ART (anti-retroviral treatment)



Medication for HIV-related co-morbid conditions



Dosette boxes & Webster Paks for those with multiple complex health issues



Emergency one-off medical expenses
