



## CLOTHESLINE PROJECT

The clothesline project is a great way to encourage our community to express their feelings about domestic and family violence by decorating a shirt. Community groups, business, schools, sports clubs and organisations are encouraged to come together to share their unique responses and decorate a shirt. All the shirts will then be strung up on clotheslines and displayed in community spaces to end the silence and raise awareness of domestic and family violence.

- On average, one woman a week is murdered by her current or former partner. (this is about to change to two women per week)
- Australian women are nearly three times more likely than men to experience violence from an intimate partner.
- Violence against women is estimated to cost \$14.4 billion to the Australian economy per annum
